## *A Legacy of Success*



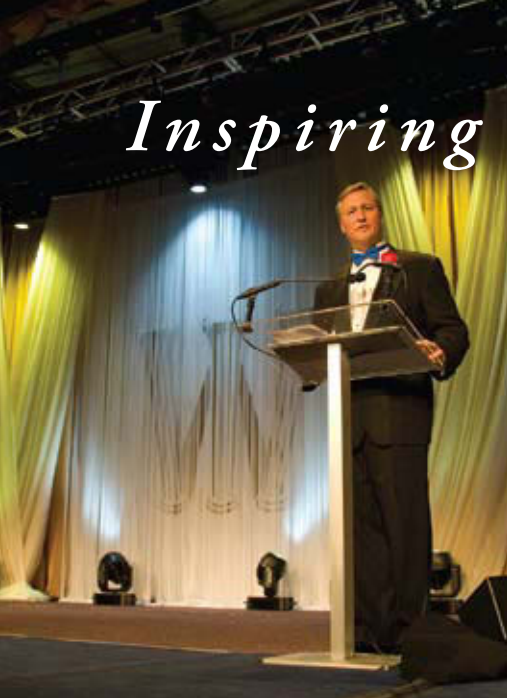
